Daphne Spain, Professor Daphne Spain, James M. Page Professor in the Department of Urban and Environmental Planning, won the 2013-2015 Cavalier's Distinguished Teaching Professorship. Dr. Spain's scholarship addresses the relationship between the built environment and social structure, with an emphasis on gender. In September 2014 she presented a keynote address for an international conference on "Engendering Cities" in Rome, and in the spring of 2015 she traveled around Asia and Africa teaching on Semester at Sea. A long-term research interest is the way in which groups of women change the urban environment. Her latest book, "Constructive Feminism: Women's Spaces and Women's Rights in the American City" has just been published by Cornell University Press.

Congressional Legislation

Roberta (Robbi) Savage is the Executive Director, Rivanna Conservation Alliance and a UVA Instructor at the School of Architecture and the Frank Batten School of Leadership and Public Policy. Robbi has more than 40 years of environmental protection experience, working in Washington DC, with Congressional, federal, state and local government officials. While representing the State Clean Water Officials, Robbi appeared before the US Congress more than 100 times and was instrumental in the development of the 1987 legislation authorizing the state revolving loan fund and the stormwater pollution control program. Robbi is the creator of World Water Monitoring Day and the 1992 and 2002 US Years of Clean Water. Internationally, Robbi served as the US Earth Day Ambassador to Germany, was the Water Ambassador to Taiwan on three occasions, was a US Delegate to both the World Water Forum in Kyoto, Japan and the Bonn Water Charter in Bonn, Germany.

Federal Regulation

Jonathan Z. Cannon, Blaine T. Phillips Distinguished Professor of Environmental Law Director, Environmental and Land Use Law Program, J.D., University of Pennsylvania Law School, B.A., Williams College. Jon joined the Law School faculty

in 1998 from the Environmental Protection Agency (USEPA), where he served as general counsel (1995-98) and assistant administrator for administration and resources management (1992-95). Prior to his work with the USEPA, Cannon was in the private practice of environmental law; served as an adjunct professor at Washington and Lee Law School, where he taught environmental law; and was a lecturer at the Law School. Professor Cannon is the author of the new book, "Environment in the Balance: The Green Movement and the Supreme Court."
